




President leads national celebrations of UAE Flag Day



PRESIDENT His Highness Sheikh Mohamed bin Zayed Al Nahyan led the national celebrations of UAE Flag Day last November 3.

At a ceremony at Qasr Al Hosn, Abu Dhabi, His Highness Sheikh Mohamed bin Zayed raised the national flag alongside Emirati astronaut Sultan Al Neyadi.

On the social media platform X, His Highness wrote: "On Flag Day, we stand in unity to raise the UAE flag which symbolises the pride and loyalty of the nation."

"As we join together to mark this occasion, I remain fully confident in the ability of the next generation to create a brighter future for all," His Highness added.

Leading up to the occasion, His Highness Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum, Vice-President and Prime Minister of the UAE and Ruler of Dubai, urged institutions to raise the UAE flag at 10:00 am on November 3, stating: "Our flag will continue to fly—a symbol of our pride and unity. It will remain high in the sky, representing our pride, glory, and sovereignty in the realm of achievement, loyalty, and fulfillment."

Meanwhile, His Highness Sheikh Mansour bin Zayed Al Nahyan, Vice-President, Deputy Prime Minister and Chairman of the Presidential Court, raised the UAE flag at Qasr Al Watan.

His Highness Sheikh Mansour stated: "The country has reached a prestigious position on the global level with its qualitative achievements and outstanding projects. With God's permission, our beloved nation will continue with confidence and determination to the future with more excellence and distinction."

President attends 9th Union Fortress military parade on Yas Island

In collaboration with the Ministry of Interior, Abu Dhabi Police, and security agencies, the Armed Forces carried out live demonstrations of mock-up combat scenarios.

HIS Highness President Sheikh Mohamed bin Zayed Al Nahyan issued a Federal Decree naming Aisha Mohamed Ahmed Belharfia as Undersecretary for Emiratisation at the Ministry of Human Resources and Emiratisation (MOHRE).

Belharfia served previously as acting undersecretary for Emiratisation Affairs and assistant undersecretary for Labour Affairs at MOHRF

She oversaw responsibilities related to labour and licences, and played a key role in developing laws and legislation governing the labour sector.

She also spearheaded multiple projects and initiatives dedicated to enhancing the efficiency of the UAE labour market.



Mohammed bin Rashid inaugurates first FNC session



ON behalf of President His Highness Sheikh Mohamed bin Zayed Al Nahyan, His Highness Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum, Vice-President and Prime Minister of the UAE and Ruler of Dubai, opened the first ordinary session of the 18th legislative chapter of the Federal National Council (FNC).

The inaugural FNC session, held in the presence of His Highness Sheikh Mansour bin Zayed Al Nahyan, UAE Vice-President, Deputy Prime Minister, and Chairman of the

Presidential Court, saw the reading of Decree No. 165 of 2023, issued by HH Sheikh Mohamed bin Zayed to convene the first ordinary term of the 18th legislative chapter.

His Highness Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid wrote on the social media platform X (formerly Twitter): "Today we inaugurated the convening of the new Federal National Council. We had a successful electoral experience and we established a new milestone in the journey of empowerment."

"The Council launches as a supporting, guiding, and assisting authority for the government, conveying the aspirations of the people of the Union," His Highness Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid added.

In October 2023, half of the 40-member Emirati parliamentary group was elected, and the remaining 20 were appointed by the rulers of each emirate. The FNC Members, half of whom are women, represent the UAE population.

Global Star Ratings unveiled for 124 federal service centres

HIS Highness Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum, Vice-President and Prime Minister of the UAE and Ruler of Dubai, revealed the results of the 5th Global Star Rating System for Services, which assesses government service centres.

The extensive evaluation covered 124 government service channels across 25 ministries and federal entities—including their

websites, smart applications, and call centres.

Notably, six service centres received a prestigious 6-star rating. Three of these top-rated centres were affiliated with the Ministry of Interior, specifically the Fujairah Traffic and Licensing Service Centre, Sharjah Traffic and Licensing Service Centre, and Wasit Comprehensive Police Station in Sharjah.

The other three 6-star centres were under the

Federal Authority for Identity, Citizenship, Customs and Ports Security, including Al Barsha Customer Service Centre in Dubai, Customer Service Centre in Al Dhafra, and Al Rashidiya Customer Service Centre in Dubai.

The goal of these assessments is to ensure that government services in the UAE are delivered efficiently and of the utmost quality to meet the needs of the people.

Law transforms DTC into public joint-stock company

HIS Highness Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum, Vice-President and Prime Minister of the UAE and Ruler of Dubai, issued Law No (21) of 2023, amending the legal status of Dubai Taxi Corporation (DTC). The law also officially changed the name to Dubai Taxi Company PJSC.

DTC is now recognised as a public joint-stock company, gaining financial and

administrative autonomy. It can proceed with launching its shares for an initial public offering (IPO).

This move aligns with Dubai's 2021 decision to list 10 government and state-owned companies on the Dubai Financial Market, aiming to boost the total volume of its stock markets to Dhs3 trillion.

Additionally, His Highness Sheikh Hamdan bin Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum, Crown Prince of Dubai and Chairman of the Executive Council of Dubai, approved Council Resolution No. (93) of 2023, detailing the 'Dubai Taxi Company's' Articles of Association, covering regulations for the IPO, defining objectives, and outlining procedures for the Board of Directors' appointment and election, amongst other operational regulations.



Mansour bin Zayed leads Ministerial Council for Dev't meeting



HIS Highness Sheikh Mansour bin Zayed Al Nahyan, Vice-President, Deputy Prime Minister and Chairman of the Presidential Court, led the Ministerial Development Council meeting during the UAE Government's Annual Meetings 2023 in Abu Dhabi.

The meeting focused on projects and initiatives geared towards improving the government's operational framework. Discussions encompassed various sectors, including energy, the environment, the UAE's Net Zero objective, human resources, new safety and security legislation, as well as decisions regarding government finance and financial markets in the UAE.

In addition, the Council members reviewed key 2023 government reports, including the Ministry of Finance's participation in the G20 Finance Ministers and Central Bank Governors meeting and the Ministry of Economy's involvement in the G20 Tourism Ministers' Meeting 2023.

UAE joins Extraordinary Arab-Islamic Summit in Riyadh

ON behalf of President His Highness Sheikh Mohamed bin Zayed Al Nahyan, His Highness Sheikh Mansour bin Zayed Al Nahyan, UAE Vice-President, Deputy Prime Minister and Chairman of the Presidential Court, led the UAE delegation to the Joint Arab-Islamic Extraordinary Summit.

The Summit was inaugurated by HRH Prince Mohammed bin Salman bin Abdulaziz Al Saud, Crown Prince and Prime Minister of the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia.

In this joint summit of the League of Arab States and the Organisation of Islamic Co-operation, leaders of Arab and Islamic countries and their representatives stressed the urgency of a ceasefire in Gaza.

They called for the protection of civilians and the establishment of safe humanitarian corridors for the delivery of urgent relief and medical aid.

The summit was held in the presence of Ahmed Aboul Gheit, Secretary-General of the League of Arab States; Hissein Brahim Taha, Secretary-General of the Organisation of Islamic Co-operation; alongside a representative of the United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees.



UAE launches National Platform for Gender Balance



HIS Highness Sheikh Mansour bin Zayed Al Nahyan, UAE Vice-President, Deputy Prime Minister and Chairman of the Presidential Court, launched the 'National Platform for Gender Balance', aimed at providing crucial data on gender balance at both federal and local government levels.

His Highness Sheikh Mansour applauded the UAE's significant progress in gender equality, and directed the UAE GBC to initiate collaborative efforts with the private sector to advance gender equality.

"The private sector is a vital partner in perpetuating the UAE's ongoing development. Now, we aspire for it to play a vital role in our aim for gender balance, thus elevating the UAE to a global leader in this field," said His Highness.

Abu Dhabi, Dubai Crown Princes announce Sirb's rollout phase



HIS Highness Sheikh Khaled bin Mohamed bin Zayed Al Nahyan, Crown Prince of Abu Dhabi and Chairman of the Executive Council of Abu Dhabi, and His Highness Sheikh Hamdan bin Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum, Crown Prince of Dubai and Chairman of the Executive Council of Dubai, have announced the implementation phase of the "Sirb" radar satellite constellation project. Their Highnesses received insights into the project's objectives, advanced satellite technology, and the process of development, manufacturing, and operation by a national industrial alliance under Emirates Space Agency supervision.

The first satellite, set to launch in 2026, will enhance the country's investment in remote sensing technologies, providing diverse sectors with precise satellite images day and night, in all weather conditions.

The Sirb project, a unique initiative for radar satellites, aims to address climate change, environmental sustainability, urban development, disaster response, food security, and more.


Emirates Genome Council meeting focuses on precision medicine

Highlighting the significance of these areas, His Highness underscored that the wise leadership aims to further boost the public health sector and solidify the country's global position in genomic research and innovation.


In the field of genomics R&D, 41 studies, approved by the UAE's Institutional Review Boards (IRB), are in progress.

Sarah bint Yousef Al Amiri, Secretary General of the Emirates Genome Council, stated: "Establishing priorities for genomic R&D is essential for the integration of effective precision medicine programmes."

During his arrival in Muscat, His Highness Sheikh Saif bin Zayed was received by Sayyid Hamoud bin Faisal Al Busaidi, Omani




Minister of Interior, and several officials.

he global food sector finds itself at the threshold of a critical transformation aimed at achieving net-zero emissions. This shift carries vital implications. It extends beyond the reduction of our carbon footprint, as it also holds the promise of ecological restoration and increased resilience in the face of the pressing challenges posed by climate change.

"Our world is faced with complex and unprecedented challenges, most notable amongst them being climate change, which now affects the world's stability and security – including food security," stated President His Highness Sheikh Mohamed bin Zayed Al Nahyan during a speech at the 27th session of the Conference of the Parties (COP27) in Sharm El Sheikh, Egypt, in November 2022.

Many countries have yet to fully realise the potential of integrating food systems into their climate strategies. From the farm to the table, there exists a multitude of strategies that can effectively address climate change, promote biodiversity, and provide support to communities most vulnerable to environmental disruptions.

While the path to transformation may vary across the globe, the urgency and significance of these efforts are universally recognised.

With great resolve, the UAE is actively contributing to the global effort to enhance food security by proactively pursuing internal solutions.

This effort, with its transformative potential, stands poised to bring about substantial changes in global food security.

KNOWLEDGE SHARING

"We seek to foster the sharing of knowledge and advance the adoption of new technologies and solutions that promote equitable access to food resources and the sustainable production, distribution and consumption of food worldwide," His Highness Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum, Vice-President and Prime Minister of the UAE and Ruler of Dubai, had said in February this year.

As per the UAE Ministry of Climate Change and Environment (MOCCAE), the annual cost of food wastage in the UAE amounts to Dhs13 billion, mirroring a worldwide trend of wastage with grave repercussions.

A staggering one-third of global food production — enough to feed 800 million people — is discarded every year. That's equivalent to 1.3 billion tonnes of food going to waste, worth approximately \$1 trillion (Dhs3.67 trn), according to the

World Food Programme (WFP).

A United Nations (UN) report, released in Abu Dhabi in October 2023, has cautioned that, if unchecked, climate change will disproportionately amplify women's vulnerability to poverty and hunger, undermining significant developmental gains.

"Globally, by mid-century, under the most severe climate projections, climate change could propel an additional 158.3 million women and girls into poverty-16 million more than men and boys. The number of women and girls facing food insecurity could rise by 236 million, compared to an increase of 131 million men and boys," stated the report titled "Progress on the Sustainable Development Goals: The Gender Snapshot 2023".

GLOBAL 'HUNGER HOTSPOTS'

The global hunger outlook is grim. Owing to fragmented international policies, the looming threat of inflation and soaring food prices is palpable. This crisis is further intensified by heatwaves.

David Beasley, former Executive Director of the WFP, offers a sombre perspective. "We're facing a perfect storm. It's not just the poorest of the poor who are at risk; millions of families, who





have so far managed to stay afloat, are now in jeopardy," he cautioned. The UN has recently pinpointed countries such as Angola, Lebanon, Madagascar, and even Ukraine as "hunger hotspots".

The UAE is employing a dual-pronged strategy. On one front, it is zealously exploring agritech innovations for selfsufficiency. On the other, it highlights the collective responsibility of its citizens, expatriates, and businesses. The aim is clear: to advocate for mindful consumption and to consider the needs of the less fortunate. The government is mobilising all sectors—public, private, and community—to champion this cause.

Mohammed bin Rashid initiated the UAE Food Bank to combat food waste and nourish vulnerable communities worldwide. Focusing on food, a fundamental human need, this initiative operates under the Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum Global Initiatives,

collaborating with authorities and charities to collect surplus food from various sources, such as hotels, supermarkets, restaurants and farms.

This initiative is not solely about charity. It represents a strategic shift towards environmental stewardship and sustainability, in line with the UAE's aspiration to be a global frontrunner in surplus food management. already achieved considerable progress: It provided meals to over 12 million beneficiaries by utilising surplus from food establishments. In the aftermath of disasters in Türkiye, Syria, and Libya, the Food Bank, in collaboration with the Emirates Red Crescent, has been a beacon of hope, dispatching hundreds of tonnes of food aid.

Environmental preservation is also at the forefront of the UAE Food Bank. It has prevented over 3,800 tonnes of food from being consigned to landfills, conserving the equivalent of 1.5 million meals. The digital transformation of its operations is set to refine the linkage between donors and beneficiaries, fortifying the circular economy and ensuring the sustainability of resources.

NATIONAL INITIATIVE

The UAE's response to the global food waste dilemma is encapsulated in the National Food Loss and Waste Initiative (Ne'ma). This nationwide collaboration was inaugurated in partnership with MOCCAE and the Abu Dhabi Crown Prince's Court. Ne'ma mirrors President His Highness Sheikh Mohamed bin Zayed Al Nahyan's vision of sustainability, social accountability, and the diminution of food loss and waste.

The Ne'ma initiative was launched during the COVID-19 pandemic, at a time when His Highness Sheikh Mohamed bin Zayed stressed the importance of acknowledging that food security goes beyond governmental roles. His Highness emphasised the critical contributions of both the private sector and consumers in ensuring food security.

Her Excellency Mariam Al Mheiri, Minister of Climate Change and Environment, has been spearheading

expansive industrial developments in the area, underscore the UAE's commitment to strengthening its food supply chain and reinforcing its status as a global trade hub."

CLIMATE-CONSCIOUS CATERING

Al Mheiri recently called on F&B vendors to champion 'Climate Conscious Catering' on a grand scale, in preparation for the pivotal climate conference

comprehensive perspective on the climate challenges facing the world. Recognising the intricate link between our food systems and the health of our planet, we've taken the proactive step to ensure that the catering at the event is both responsible and climate-conscious. This is in line with the focus we've placed on the Emirates Declaration," she said.

"This approach, a 'COP first', is centred around the Sustainable Catering Strategy devised for COP28. It aims to demonstrate the lasting benefits and legacy of such a strategy," Al Mheiri added

The strategy aims to showcase the

viability of providing sustainable food and beverages on a large scale, and pledges to offer a two-thirds plant-based menu, reduce the carbon and water footprint of the food served, and ensure a focus on nutrition, appropriate portion sizes, affordability, and waste reduction. Both the MOCCAE and COP28 are seeking F&B partners who share this ethos.

"Implementing this programme will require substantial collaboration and commitment from the event's caterers. However, I am optimistic about the prevailing willingness. The food must be palatable, and we are dedicated to presenting the concept to attendees in a compelling and informative way. Both elements are crucial for instigating behavioural change," Al Mheiri added.

FOOD INDUSTRY'S STEPS

In Dubai, hotels are not merely discarding leftovers; they are analysing and reducing waste at the source. A leading hotel group is even utilising artificial intelligence (Al) to tackle food waste, according to the Dubai Municipality. The Municipality's efforts in managing food waste are significant, with around 4,000 tonnes of food, including inedible items, being repurposed annually into organic fertilisers or animal feed.

In a significant push for sustainability, 2023 saw the Dubai Municipality donate over 70 tonnes of food to the UAE Food Bank and transform nearly 400 tonnes into valuable compost. This initiative is in line with Dubai's ambitious food security strategy, which aims to diversify imports, increase local production, and cut food waste, which globally accounts for over 30 per cent of food produced, according to FAO statistics.

Dawoud Al Hajri, Director-General of Dubai Municipality, emphasises that the drive will reduce the food industry's environmental impact, targeting decreased greenhouse gas emissions and a lower carbon footprint. The Municipality has also developed guide for retail food outlets to minimise waste and provided educational materials to importers and exporters to improve supply chain efficiency.

SUSTAINABLE IRRIGATION

The Abu Dhabi Agriculture and Food Safety Authority (ADAFSA) is making significant progress towards agricultural and food sustainability, in line with the National Food Security Strategy 2051.

ADAFSA is cultivating an integrated



food security system, focusing on modern agricultural technology to curb water consumption and boost productivity — through greenhouse agriculture and the augmentation of local production of crops and livestock to ensure uninterrupted access to safe and nutritious food.

The efforts of ADAFSA are buttressed by the nation's robust urban infrastructure. Facilities like those in Khalifa Industrial City (KIZAD) provide a safeguard during crises and emergencies.

The Authority is also enacting initiatives to alleviate water scarcity that are suitable for agriculture, aiming for agricultural sustainability and the conservation of natural resources. Farms are also urged to participate in the Abu Dhabi Good Agricultural Practices (AD GAP) programme, with 1,536 farms already certified under GlobalGAP, a globally recognised standard ensuring Good Agricultural Practices.

EMIRATI FIRM TRANSFORMS **USED COOKING OIL INTO BIODIESEL**

A forward-thinking Emirati entrepreneur based in Dubai, Yousif bin Saeed Al Lootah, is spearheading a green revolution by innovatively converting used cooking oil into biodiesel. As the Founder and CEO of Lootah Biofuels, the 32-year-old is dedicated to fostering a circular economy, where waste materials are repurposed, reducing environmental impact. His commitment extends beyond the UAE, as his biodiesel is now being used to power vehicles not only locally but also in regions beyond the borders of the emirates.

For over a decade, Lootah has been collecting waste oil from major companies and refining it into clean fuel, which is now powering fleets of trucks and being exported to countries like the United Kingdom, the Netherlands, Germany, and India. His efforts are a testament to the potential of reusing products to conserve resources and reduce environmental impact.

Lootah's journey began with the SS Lootah Group's green car programme, sparking the idea of using alternative fuels to cut emissions. "Biodiesel blends emerged as a possible answer," he said. His company, established in 2010, has grown to produce 60 million litres of biofuel annually, contributing to a reduction of over 500 tonnes of carbon dioxide last year alone.

The state-of-the-art factory in Dubai Industrial City, capable of supplying 100,000 litres of biodiesel daily. As the UAE's largest collector of used cooking oil, Lootah Biofuels collaborates with prominent hospitality and retail groups, showcasing the scalability of sustainable practices.

He envisions every fuel station in the country offering biofuel, a move he believes is crucial for energy diversification and a step towards decarbonising transport.

SMART FARMING SOLUTIONS

The UAE's commitment to innovation is evident in its adoption of smart solutions for home gardening initiatives. The "Bustani" exhibition at Masdar City's Sustainable Villa is a testament to this, displaying over 15 cutting-edge solutions for food production, water management, and waste recycling, including chemical-free vegetable cultivation and smart poultry farming technologies. The Sharjah Research Technology and Innovation Park is also leading the charge, developing new methods for agricultural production and solar-powered water desalination, contributing to a comprehensive sustainability system.

WHO HOLDS THE SECOND DECISION?

While the authority to terminate your employment may rest in the hands of others, the power to shape the course of your journey afterward lies in your own decisions

he story is told that the renowned Egyptian journalist and writer Mohamed Hassanein Heikal once attended a meeting where each participant introduced themselves and mentioned the positions they currently or previously held.

When his turn came, Heikal, often referred to with the title "professor", simply said, "Mohamed Hassanein Heikal... Journalist!"

Attendees were surprised by Heikal's modest introduction, considering his various prestigious roles, including serving as the Minister of Information and editing the renowned Egyptian newspaper, *Al-Ahram*.

He left *Al-Ahram* in 1974 when the former Egyptian president, Anwar Sadat, issued a decree for him to move from *Al-Ahram* to the Abdin Palace as a presidential advisor.

Heikal declined the transfer. He left the newspaper and responded to international news agencies with the statement: "The president has the decision to remove me from *Al-Ahram*, but as for where I go afterward, that decision is mine alone, and my decision is to devote myself to writing my books and nothing else."

Later, Heikal summarised his stance in a statement to the British newspaper *The Sunday Times*, saying: "I exercised my right to express my opinion, then President Sadat used his power. The president's authority allows him to tell

me to leave *Al-Ahram*, but it does not empower him to determine where I go after that. The first decision is his alone, and the second decision is mine alone."

I recalled this story when Bassel Souraya, **999 Magazine** assistant editor, called me, asking about the descriptor I would like to use for myself in the article and whether I wanted to mention my profession.

I replied that I have never defined myself by my job in all the articles I have written throughout my life because positions change over time and eventually fade away.

However, the descriptor "Emirati Writer and Journalist" that I always wanted to accompany my articles remains for a lifetime. People take it with them to their graves while leaving behind all occupational titles for those who will replace them.

This is the cycle of life that we inherit from those who preceded us, and we must pass it on to those who come after us.

I return to Heikal's words, which sparked my interest in writing

about this topic when he said that the second decision belongs to him alone. This indeed happened after the professor left *Al-Ahram* upon President Sadat's decision.

He went on to accomplish his writing projects, releasing the book *The Road to Ramadan* in 1975, which entered the list of the top five best-selling books in Britain in its first week of release by Collins, the largest publishing house in Britain.

The book was translated into Arabic. In the same year the book was published, former Egyptian Prime Minister Mamdouh Salem, who was tasked with forming a new ministry, contacted Heikal, proposing his participation in the new ministry as deputy prime minister in charge of media and culture. However, Heikal declined.

I frequently find myself perplexed when encountering individuals

who label themselves as journalists or writers without any observable body of journalistic work, articles, or published books. Despite my extensive 50-year involvement in the media scene and ongoing vigilance over cultural developments during this period, their contributions remain elusive to me.

I feel protective of the media, which I have dealt with as a hobby and passion more than a job, and I do not object to labelling these individuals as influencers because many of them do have an impact, regardless of whether it is positive or negative, on various segments of society

with different ages, cultures and interests.

However, they all eventually influence people with various messages and provide advice, ranging from medical and economic to social and even political. Despite the young age of some of these influencers, the limited culture and education of others, and their lack of specialisation in the topics they address, their messages still affect many.

Despite the clear commercial nature dominating their messages, where advertisements constitute a significant source of income for many, this is a legitimate right that no one can object to, as long as what they offer does not conflict with the values, ethics, customs, and traditions of society, and does not violate the laws and regulations of the state.

I concur with Heikal's perspective that while someone may possess the authority to terminate your employment, they do not hold sway over the choices you make regarding your subsequent path.

I replied that I have never defined myself by my job in all the articles I have written throughout my life because positions change over time and eventually fade away

THE MAN OF THE ARAB ENVIRONMENT





s the UAE commemorates its 52nd UAE Union Day amidst the pivotal COP28 Summit, this is a moment of introspection on the green legacy of the late Sheikh Zayed bin Sultan Al Nahyan, the nation's founding father.

His visionary leadership laid the foundations for the union of seven emirates and set a benchmark in environmental stewardship—earning him the well-deserved title of 'the Man of the Arab Environment'.

Sheikh Zayed's leadership was marked by a deep respect for nature, an ethos embedded in the UAE's policy framework since its inception. His early decree to revise local water ownership rights highlighted a commitment to equitable resource distribution and foresight in curbing water wastage — a critical issue in the arid landscapes of the Gulf.

"We pay the utmost care and attention

to our environment for it is an integral part of our country, our history and our heritage. Our forefathers and our ancestors lived in this land and co-existed with its environment, on land and at sea, and instinctively realised the need to preserve it," Sheikh Zayed had once said.

Under his watch, the city of Al Ain flourished into one of the greenest cities in the Arab world. This transformation was not merely an agricultural achievement but a testament to Sheikh Zayed's belief in the balance between human advancement and environmental conservation.

ENVIRONMENTAL COUNCIL

In 1975, the creation of the High Environmental Council solidified the Founding Father's conservation ethos. The subsequent hunting prohibition in the 1980s, aimed at safeguarding indigenous

wildlife, was a courageous step that highlighted his commitment to preserving the nation's biodiversity.

This prohibition aligned with conservation programmes such as the Arabian Oryx breeding initiative, which rescued the species from the verge of extinction.

Sheikh Zayed's afforestation projects received international acclaim. Over 140 million trees were planted in Abu Dhabi alone, earning him accolades such as the Food and Agriculture Organisation's Gold Medal and the World Wide Fund for Nature's (WWF) Golden Panda Award. This Centre is pivotal to the UAE's strategy to nurture an innovative ecosystem, harnessing space data to confront global sustainability challenges.



It aims to stimulate the growth of the space industry, increasing the number of companies and patents, and fostering a culture of space expertise within the nation.

The UAE Space Agency's Space Analytics and Solutions (SAS) Programme further emphasises this commitment. By cultivating local and international partnerships, the SAS Programme is poised to develop solutions for global sustainability challenges, reinforcing the UAE's status as a leader in the space industry.


Collaborations such as the one with "Planet Labs" to create a loss and damage atlas highlight the UAE's proactive approach. This atlas, informed by satellite data, will be crucial in assisting nations to manage the impacts of climate change.

The UAE's space exploration programmes also include plans to launch Synthetic Aperture Radar (SAR) satellites, which aims to provide invaluable data for a multitude of applications, from urban planning to climate change mapping.

These satellites will be used for remote sensing, offering high-resolution images that are essential for environmental monitoring and analysis.


Projects such as MeznSat, a nanosatellite developed in partnership with the UAE Space Agency, the American University of Ras Al Khaimah, and Khalifa University, underscore the UAE's commitment to scientific research in space. MeznSat's mission to monitor greenhouse gases and the red tide phenomenon is a testament to the UAE's dedication to environmental monitoring and research.

Furthermore, the Mohammed bin Rashid Space Centre and Dubai Municipality's launch of "DM-SAT1," the first environmental nanometric satellite, marks a significant advancement in environmental data analysis. This satellite's mission to monitor air pollutants and greenhouse gases will provide crucial data for devising strategies to tackle urban pollution and climate change.





GREEN LEGACY



BANKING ON GREEN INITIATIVES

In a move that resonates with the environmental vision of Sheikh Zayed, the Central Bank of the UAE (CBUAE) recently collaborated with the Bank for International Settlements (BIS), the Emirates Institute of Finance (EIF), and the COP28 Presidency to launch the COP28 UAE TechSprint. This initiative encourages global financial innovators to contribute to the development of tech solutions in sustainable finance.

The COP28 UAE TechSprint aims to leverage state-of-the-art technologies such as artificial intelligence (AI), blockchain, and the Internet of Things (IoT) to address three critical challenges in sustainable finance: enhancing reporting and disclosure, auditing and transparency, and informed impact assessments.

Meanwhile, the UAE's national banks are aligning with this initiative, directing over \$51.8 billion (Dhs190 bn) into sustainable projects in 2022 alone. First Abu Dhabi Bank (FAB) leads with a \$75 billion (Dhs275 bn) pledge to green financing by 2030, while Abu Dhabi Commercial Bank (ADCB) has formulated a science-based plan to reduce its carbon footprint. Abu Dhabi Islamic Bank (ADIB) is advancing its green financing and investment initiatives, with a \$1.7 billion (Dhs6.2 bn) allocation to sustainable projects.

Emirates NBD has made significant strides by signing the UAE Climate-Responsible Companies Pledge, furthering the nation's decarbonisation goals. Dubai Islamic Bank (DIB) has made a landmark \$1 billion (Dhs3.67 bn) sukuk issuance for sustainable financing, the largest by a Middle Eastern financial institution.

In the spirit of Sheikh Zayed's environmental legacy, the UAE endorsed the Mangrove Breakthrough. This initiative, a focal point at COP28, aims to restore and protect 15 million hectares of mangroves globally by 2030

Mashreg's \$20 billion (Dhs73.4 bn) contribution to sustainable financing in the first half of the year is a testament to the sector's commitment to supporting the UAE's sustainability goals, including the ambitious target of net zero by 2050.

The UAE's banking sector, by channelling funds into green initiatives, is not only honouring Sheikh Zayed's legacy but also reinforcing the UAE's position as a hub for green finance and innovation.

MANGROVE PLANTATION

In the spirit of Sheikh Zayed's environmental legacy, the UAE has taken a significant step in the global fight against climate change by endorsing the Mangrove Breakthrough. This initiative, a focal point at COP28, aims to restore and protect 15 million hectares of mangroves globally by 2030.

The Mangrove Breakthrough, is a collaborative effort between the Global Mangrove Alliance and the UN Climate Change High-level Champions. CLEAN ENERGY

In a bold move that resonates with the environmental stewardship of Sheikh Zayed, the UAE recently pledged a transformative \$4.5 billion (Dhs16.5 bn) to escalate clean energy projects across Africa. ith a robust fleet of around 900 commercial aircraft and fresh orders secured at the Dubai Airshow 2023, the UAE is resolutely

committed to steering its aviation sector into a more sustainable direction.

This direction is leading towards greater adoption of Sustainable Aviation Fuel (SAF), seen as a game-changer alternative for conventional jet fuels. It has the capacity to reduce greenhouse gas emissions from flying by an impressive 80 per cent compared to fossil-based jet fuel.

Propelled by a nod from UAE leaders and substantial investments from key industry players, the use of SAF is expected to gain momentum.

In October 2023, His Highness Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum, Vice-President and Prime Minister of the UAE and Ruler of Dubai, stated on X (formerly Twitter): "The UAE announced its goal to achieve carbon neutrality by 2050. Our development model will consider this goal, and all agencies will work as one team to

"The UAE will invest Dhs600 billion in clean and renewable energy by 2050, and will play its global role in combating climate change," His Highness added.

Numerous SAF-related research and development initiatives in the country are specifically focused on improving the production processes and costeffectiveness of this eco-friendly fuel.

As these efforts continue to advance. the outlook is optimistic, with SAF expected to become more accessible and economically viable. This, in turn, is likely to further encourage its adoption by the UAE's burgeoning aviation industry.

SAF EXPLORATION

Currently, the global aviation industry predominantly relies on fossil fuels typically unleaded kerosene or a blend of naphtha and kerosene. Combustion of these fuels results in the emission of various pollutants, including carbon monoxide (CO), carbon dioxide (CO2), and nitrogen oxides, known as greenhouse gases (GHGs).

A number of noteworthy initiatives aimed at championing sustainable air travel using SAF are being pursued by Abu Dhabi-based Etihad Airways, Dubai-based Emirates, and UAE renewable energy company Masdar.

In October 2023, Dubai International Airport's (DXB) Emirates Flight EK 412 fuelled by SAF took off for Sydney. The supplier, Shell Aviation, had delivered 315,000 gallons of blended SAF to the DXB airport fuelling system.

Before this, Emirates welcomed the UAE's Year of Sustainability with a demonstration flight on 100 per cent SAF on January 30, 2023. It was the first flight out of the Middle East and North Africa to be powered by 100 per cent SAF.

Meanwhile, in November 2022, Etihad transported COP27 delegates from Washington Dulles Airport to Abu Dhabi via Sharm El Sheikh, Egypt, on a net-zero emissions flight powered by SAF. It was part of the Dreamliner programme.

Etihad had introduced its Greenliner

Programme in 2019, dedicating a Boeing 787-10 Dreamliner to focus on sustainability initiatives. This programme was developed in collaboration with Boeing and engine manufacturer GE.

GLOBAL AVIATION EMISSIONS

According to the World Economic Forum, citing Our World in Data, aviation is responsible for approximately 2 to 2.5 per cent of global carbon dioxide emissions, with most aircraft powered by jet petrol.

In Europe, aviation emissions increased from 1.5 per cent of total emissions in 1990 to 4.7 per cent in 2019, the year preceding the COVID-19 pandemic.

Given the post-pandemic rebound, aviation emissions in 2022 reached almost 800 metric tonnes (Mt) of CO2, about 80 per cent of the pre-pandemic level.

The International Energy Agency (IEA) stated in its 2023 report: "Many technical measures related to low-emission fuels, improvements in airframes and engines, operational optimisation and demand restraint solutions are needed to curb growth in emissions and ultimately reduce them this decade in order to get on track with the Net Zero Emissions by 2050 (NZE) Scenario."

SAF PRODUCTION

In 2022, SAF production tripled to 300 million litres, up by 200 per cent from 100 million litres in 2021, as per the International Air Transport Association (IATA). Airlines purchased all the available SAF supply globally - despite the price differential to conventional jet fuel.



Last year, IATA estimated the average SAF price at around \$2,400/tonne (Dhs8,800/tonne), albeit with significant differences across regions — around two-and-half times higher than the price of conventional jet fuel.

Still, the SAF market remains in its early stages of development, thus posing a huge challenge to the task of estimating a global SAF price. SAF fuel production remained very low, a mere fraction (0.1 per cent) of the overall volume of jet fuel in 2022.

Legal mandates form a significant factor in the SAF equation. In May 2023, the European Union announced a mandate stipulating that fuel manufacturers and suppliers must provide 2 per cent of all fuel at airports as SAF by 2025. This quota is set to rise to 6 per cent in 2030, 20 per cent in 2035, and an ambitious 70 per cent by 2050.

Moreover, anticipated "blending mandates" and production goals are expected to stimulate SAF activity. Spearheading this initiative is the International Civil Aviation Organisation (ICAO), which has pledged to achieve net zero operations in global commercial

DID YOU KNOW?

aviation by 2050. That date may be a long way off. But, without corrective measures, current trends could triple the aviation industry's carbon emissions by then, as warned by the United Nations.

WHY SAF MATTERS

Over the next 30 years, in addition to the electrification of aviation, SAF can significantly cut carbon emissions in all aviation segments, as per IATA.

Today, SAF forms part of a multi-

pronged approach to keep global temperature rise this century well below 2°C above pre-industrial levels and to pursue efforts to limit the temperature increase even further to 1.5°Celsius, as agreed in 2015 at COP21 (also known as the "Paris Agreement").

While 1.5°C seems insignificant, it could make extreme heatwaves more widespread as greenhouse gases, carbon dioxide in particular, increasingly trap the heat in the planet's atmosphere. Significantly, a temperature rise of 1.5°C

would result in approximately 14 per cent of the global population experiencing severe heatwaves at least once every five years. According to NASA's calculations, if the temperature rises by 2°C, this number will escalate to 37 per cent.

TURBULENCE AHEAD

It is also manufactured in small quantities.

In September 2023, Willie Walsh, Director General at IATA, said, "SAF will always cost a premium compared to kerosene. I believe the industry is ready to embrace that. The industry recognises the problem and is doing everything it can to address it. We need to achieve the targets because there isn't an option here."

Mariam Al Qubaisi, Head of Sustainability at Etihad, told the media in

years and it's about time we own up to our responsibility to decarbonise."

"We can do better together, because sustainability is not an area for competition, it's an area for collaboration," she added.

SHARED RESPONSIBILITY

Various factors play a role in low SAF adoption amongst airlines, one of which is the pending authorisation for the full adoption of 100 per cent SAF in regular commercial use. Additionally, not all airports have the requisite infrastructure to facilitate SAF, and its production facility must be near the airport to prevent offsetting emission reductions achieved during flights with emissions from transportation-related activities.

Sir Tim Clark, President of Emirates Airline, acknowledged that there is still "a long road ahead" to achieve more substantial progress in achieving net zero in the aviation sector.

"Powering flights from our Dubai hub is just one of the steps we have taken to reduce emissions and concretely help our customers minimise their own carbon footprint," Clark remarked following the take-off of Emirates flight EK 412 fuelled by SAF last month.

"We still have a long road ahead, and we hope that our partnership with Shell Aviation inspires more producers to address the supply gaps and make SAF readily available in major hubs like Dubai, as well as other points on our network," Clark added.

TRENDS BEYOND THE UAE

Globally, airlines are acknowledging the urgency of minimising their carbon footprint and are progressively turning

to SAF as a practical solution. A notable example is Cebu Pacific, the Philippines' leading airline, which launched its inaugural SAF-powered flight from Tokyo-Narita, Japan, to Manila, Philippines, in October 2023.

The flight utilised an Airbus A321neo and incorporated 40 per cent blended SAF sourced from Neste Corporation and supplied by Itochu Corporation. This initiative led to a 44 per cent reduction in carbon emissions per passenger.

Alexander Lao, President and Chief Commercial Officer at Cebu Pacific, said: "Other decarbonisation programmes that we have put in place include investing in fuel-efficient NEOs, optimisation of flight plans, and adoption of fuel efficiency best practices to minimise fuel consumption. All these are concrete sustainability initiatives that bolster our commitment and support for the aviation industry's goal of flying net-zero by 2050."

In the same month, the airline signed an MOU with Neste, the largest producer of SAF in the world. This effort aims to attain net-zero CO2 emissions by the year 2050.

OPPORTUNITIES ON THE HORIZON

The Middle East and North Africa, despite being known for fossil fuel reserves, offer significant potential for sustainable aviation fuel. Initiatives led by various stakeholders aim to diversify the energy mix and reduce carbon emissions.

As a non-conventional aviation fuel classified under the umbrella of "biofuel". SAF is commonly derived from diverse biomass sources. These include corn

grain, oilseeds, agricultural residues, forest residues, wet waste like manures and wastewater treatment sludge, wood waste. and dedicated energy crops.

A sustainability industry report by 4Air underscores the region's access to seawater and significant solar potential, providing opportunities for both biomass and non-biomass feedstocks, including solar- and wind-power-to-liquid (PtL) solutions.

In the UAE, salicornia, a plant resilient to salt, has proven successful as a locally cultivated sustainable fuel. In 2019, Etihad Airways operated a flight using this fuel, in collaboration with the Sustainable Bioenergy Research Consortium. The fuel production process brought extra advantages by employing the Seawater Energy and Agriculture System, enabling the simultaneous cultivation of seafood in the same environment as the crop.

Moreover, teaming up with the World Economic Forum, the UAE has devised a plan to produce SAF and renewable hydrogen through PtL technologies by

2050. The collaboration's report suggests that PtL SAF could fulfil up to 73 per cent of the fuel demand for flights refuelling in the country.

The UAE has also identified possible resources for the production of SAF, such as halophytes, or plants that grow in salt marshes and other brackish conditions, municipal solid waste, used cooking oil, agricultural waste and microalgae, amongst others.

WINGS OF CHANGE

The pathway to achieving net zero aviation will undergo thorough examination at the Global Sustainable Aviation Forum during COP28. Deliberations will cover aspects such as SAF readiness, demand projections, production challenges, and airline commitments.

Notably, the UAE has proactively made substantial investments and exerted efforts well in advance of this event. positioning itself as a committed host of COP28.







In 2020, the Sustainable Aviation Fuel Initiative (SAFI)-UAE was launched to guarantee the aviation sector's growth "by enabling, promoting, and developing a vibrant Sustainable Aviation Fuel industry in the country".

Meanwhile, in October 2023, Abu
Dhabi National Oil Company's (ADNOC)
Ruwais refinery earned the International
Sustainability Carbon Certification (ISCC),
marking a significant development in SAF
production. While SAF currently constitutes
less than 0.1 per cent of global aviation
fuel, ADNOC, being the first Middle
East company with ISCC, plans to fuel
international airlines at Zayed International
Airport (formerly Abu Dhabi International
Airport) using SAF derived from recycled
cooking oil blended with jet fuel.

At Abu Dhabi Sustainability Week 2023, Tadweer, Masdar, ADNOC, and Etihad Airways announced a collaborative feasibility study exploring SAF, renewable diesel, and naphtha production from municipal solid waste and renewable hydrogen. The study could lead to the establishment of the first commercial-scale manufacturing site in Abu Dhabi.

Cassie Mackie, Vice President
Procurement & Supply Chain at Etihad
Airways, said: "The industry must get
serious about decarbonisation and
this type of collaboration between
governments, corporates and the aviation
sector, which increases SAF supply and
availability at airports, helps pave the way
for broader adoption."

Etihad stated that, while aviation makes up only 2 per cent of global greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions, it still requires the sector "to learn how to establish initiatives that will make a difference".

AVIATION R&D TO FIGHT EMISSIONS

In May 2023, Emirates announced that it was committing \$200 million (Dhs735.6 million) to a research fund aimed at reducing the impact of fossil fuels in

commercial aviation.

This was deemed the biggest single commitment by any airline to sustainability, with the funds allocated over a three-year period. Emirates said it is actively seeking partnerships with prominent organisations focused on developing solutions in advanced fuel and energy technologies.

Clark said: "We looked long and hard at the reality we face in commercial aircraft and engine technology, fuel supply chain, and our industry's regulatory and eco-system requirements. It's clear that with the current pathways available to airlines in terms of emissions reduction, our industry won't be able to hit net zero targets in the prescribed timeline."

"We believe our industry needs better solutions, and that's why we're looking to partner with leading organisations on R&D to contribute meaningfully to practical solutions for the long-term sustainability of commercial aviation."



UAE'S INITIATIVES TO ENABLE SAF TRANSITION

CERTIFICATION

In October 2023, the Ruwais refinery of the Abu Dhabi National Oil Company (ADNOC) received the International Sustainability Carbon Certification (ISCC) to produce sustainable aviation fuel (SAF). The SAF is manufactured from used cooking oil feedstock, which is blended with jet fuel. ADNOC is the first company in the Middle East to get this certificate.

2

100% SAF

In January 2023, Emirates marked the UAE's Year of Sustainability with a significant flight. A Boeing 777-300ER, powered by 100 per cent SAF in one engine, flew for over an hour over Dubai. This symbolic move demonstrated SAF's performance, safety and reliability. The test flight, showcasing SAF blends in higher proportions, contributed valuable insights for industry standardisation and future approval of 100 per cent drop-in SAF as a jet fuel replacement.

COMMERCIAL-SCALE SAF PRODUCTION

This year also began with Tadweer (Abu Dhabi Waste Management Company), Masdar, ADNOC, Etihad Airways, amongst others, announcing at Abu Dhabi Sustainability Week 2023 that they would carry out a joint feasibility study to explore the production of SAF and products, such as renewable diesel and naphtha, using municipal solid waste and renewable hydrogen. Based on the studies, the partners will also consider setting up the first commercial-scale manufacturing site in Abu Dhabi.


NET-ZERO AVIATION

On December 6, 2023, COP 28's Global Sustainable Aviation Forum in the Green Zone will explore the trajectory to net-zero aviation. Experts, including government and industry representatives, will assess SAF readiness, demand projections, production challenges, and airline commitments. Panel discussions will focus on scaling up SAF production, feedstock availability, and the role of blended finance in supporting SAF production in the developing world to meet sector-wide goals.

MASDAR-BOEING PARTNERSHIP

The UAE's clean energy company, Masdar, has partnered with aerospace company Boeing to supercharge the SAF industry in the country and beyond. The MoU, signed in October 2023, will support the commercial aviation industry's goal of achieving net-zero emissions by 2050. "Global net-zero goals can only be achieved through international collaboration and innovation. Ahead of the UAE hosting COP28, we will continue to leverage our combined knowledge, expertise, and passion to support industry and create a more sustainable future for all," said Mohammad Abdelqader El Ramahi, Chief Green Hydrogen Officer at Masdar.

mobile phone while behind the wheel might appear harmless; truth be told, it brings serious risks to your life and limb.

In early October 2023, Dubai Police disclosed that six fatalities in road accidents this year were attributed to drivers using mobile phones. Over the first eight months of this year, 35,527 drivers were caught for using their mobile phones. This traffic violation was linked to 99 accidents, which resulted in 50 injuries. Major General Saif Muhair Al Mazrouei, Director of the General Department of Traffic at Dubai Police, emphasised that mobile phone usage while driving significantly impairs reaction time, especially when engaging in activities like browsing social media or texting. He stressed that a momentary lapse can lead to accidents, injuries, and lasting consequences for both the driver and other road users.

Point of fact: Motorists using their devices while driving may commit various errors. Such errors compromise road safety, not just for the distracted driver but for everyone around him.

Many people believe they can multitask "safely", convinced that answering a call or sending a quick message won't divert their attention.

If you're convinced this to be the case, it's worth considering the words of John

Medina, a prominent developmental molecular biologist and author of the internationally acclaimed bestseller Brain Rules. He wrote: "The brain is not capable of multitasking. We can talk and breathe, but when it comes to higher-level tasks, we just can't do it...The brain is a sequential processor and large fractions of a second are consumed every time the brain switches tasks."

EFFICIENCY OR TRAGEDY?

A humorous saying encapsulates this truth: "Multitasking is the art of messing up everything all at once." But this "messing up" is not funny. When it comes to activities like calling or texting while driving, they not only impact our own lives but also jeopardise the safety of other road users.

"Using a phone while behind the

wheel not only diverts a driver's attention but also significantly increases the likelihood of accidents." said Al Mazrouei. "A momentary lapse in concentration while checking social media or texting can have devastating consequences."

PENALTIES

The UAE traffic regulations, as outlined in Ministerial Resolution No. (178) of 2017 on Rules and Procedures of Traffic Control, detail the penalties for such violations.

A driver caught using a mobile phone while driving, or found to be distracted by any other means may incur a fine of Dhs800, in addition to the imposition of four black points on their driving license.

As per law enforcement agencies, even utilising a hands-free device to answer a call diverts your attention from the road,

providing no significant safety improvement when taking calls while driving.

The Roads and Transport Authority (RTA) handbook strongly recommends establishing the practice of exclusively using mobile phones when your vehicle is stationary. When driving, it advises having a passenger manage your phone calls or allowing incoming calls to be directed to voicemail instead. This approach prioritises safety on the road and minimises distractions.

CAN'T THAT CALL WAIT?

Various forms of driver distraction exist, but the use of mobile phones is a paramount concern for traffic authorities. The available evidence underscores a concerning trend, indicating that this behaviour is on the rise, largely driven by the widespread use of mobile phones.

Traffic safety hinges on undivided attention and complete awareness of your surroundings. Any distraction becomes a perilous ingredient in the mix.

When a driver uses their mobile phone while behind the wheel, the consequences become glaringly evident. The vehicle's pace can become frustratingly sluggish on a highway, compelling others to overtake. Equally concerning is the driver's inability to maintain a straight path, occasionally drifting into neighbouring lanes, putting themselves and others at risk. Then the question arises: why would anyone willingly assume responsibility for such dire consequences? As is often the case, certain human behaviours seem to defy common sense.

Mohammed Dhahi Al Humairi, Director of the Traffic and Patrols Directorate at the Central Operations Sector at Abu Dhabi Police. He added that using a mobile phone while driving causes a loss of concentration on the road which leads to serious accidents.

Drivers, he said, are breaking the law when they use their hand-held devices

to take photographs, record movies, browse the Internet, interact on social media, talk on the phone, or take pictures.

"Motorists should stop the dangerous habit of using mobile phones while driving to guarantee their safety and the safety of other road users," said Al Humairi.

GROWING TREND

In a 2020 report from the World Health Organization (WHO), it was revealed that studies from various nations indicate a growing trend in the use of mobile phones by drivers while on the road.

This trend has seen a surge in the past decade, with observed usage rates as high as 11 per cent at any given moment, potentially even higher when hands-free mobile phones are considered.

In many countries, the full extent of this problem remains uncertain: data on mobile phone usage is not routinely collected in the aftermath of traffic accidents.

UAE authorities have put in place strict regulations and penalties to deter the use of mobile phones while operating a vehicle.

In January 2021, Abu Dhabi Police introduced a cutting-edge automated system designed to identify seat belt and mobile phone violations amongst drivers in Abu Dhabi, known as the Vehicular Attention and Safety Tracker (VAST). This innovative system is a network of radar monitoring systems equipped with Al-powered cameras capable of capturing high-resolution images. Motorists who commit violations receive a prompt text message detailing the nature of their infringement.

Previously, in 2020, Abu Dhabi Police had introduced smart patrols that were strategically positioned on various roads throughout the Capital. These smart patrols







leverage advanced technology to detect and address traffic offences such as failure to wear seat belts, mobile phone usage while driving, speeding, and other violations.

Dubai Police are also taking proactive measures by conducting multiple awareness campaigns aimed at highlighting the consequences of mobile phone distractions. These campaigns feature real-life incidents where individuals were engrossed with their

phones while driving, resulting in devastating accidents, debilitating injuries, or, in the worst cases, fatalities.

"Unfortunately, some only learn when tragedy strikes," Al Mazrouei said. He emphasised the utmost importance of all road users adhering to traffic regulations and steering clear of any distractions while driving, be it making calls, texting, or indulging in social media browsing.



KEEP YOUR FOCUS ON THE ROAD

A 2017 observational study conducted by researchers from the Department of Industrial Engineering and Engineering Management at the University of Sharjah investigated the personal characteristics influencing mobile phone usage while driving. The researchers found that 11.3 per cent of drivers were texting while driving, and an additional 13.8 per cent were engaged in phone conversations.

Meanwhile, a study by Monash University in Malaysia revealed that young drivers' time spent with their eyes off the road increased by a shocking 400 per cent when texting.

Distracted driving can lead to a wide range of errors, some of which may be fatal. These include a lack of awareness of surrounding road users and potential hazards, failure to observe road signs and warnings, difficulty maintaining the recommended safe speed, insufficient following distance from the vehicle in front, and poor lane discipline, including changing lanes without signalling.

RTA Dubai underscored the dangers of mobile phone distractions in its light motor vehicle driving handbook, stating "Mobile phones distract drivers and can cause them to either make mistakes that they would not otherwise make or to react too slowly."

The handbook goes on to list several common errors that distracted motorists are prone to, including straddling lanes on multi-lane roads, erratic speed fluctuations, difficulty maintaining a safe following distance, and lapses in judgment and awareness of safe traffic gaps.

BETTER TURN IT OFF

In 2019, a tragic incident occurred in Ajman, where a 49-year-old Arab national lost his life, while his 35-year-old wife and their two young children, aged 3 and 4, sustained minor injuries. This unfortunate event unfolded on Al Ittihad Street in the Al Zawra area in Ajman when their vehicle overturned.

According to Lieutenant Colonel Saif Abdullah Al Falasi, Director of the Traffic and Patrols Department at Ajman Police, this accident resulted from the driver's distraction with a mobile phone, leading to the vehicle abruptly swerving and colliding with the pavement before ultimately overturning onto the central reservation.

Regrettably, the driver could not survive the injuries he sustained during the vehicle's overturning, as he had neglected to fasten his seat belt.

Al Falasi emphasised that distractions caused by mobile phones have become a significant factor contributing to traffic accidents. He underscored the importance of driver concentration, avoiding mobile phone use while driving, ensuring seat belt usage, and adhering to traffic regulations.



SERIOUS RISK

A 2020 survey by Abu Dhabi Police revealed that approximately 80 per cent of road fatalities and serious injuries are caused by drivers chatting on social media, browsing the Internet, speaking on phones, and other distractive behaviours.

Brigadier Salem Abdullah bin Barak Al Dhaheri, Deputy Director of the Traffic and Patrols Directorate at Abu Dhabi Police, said using a mobile phone while driving has become commonplace amongst many drivers, particularly young people. This


poses a serious risk to public safety.

"Motorists should avoid using phones while driving their vehicles because it breaks the concentration of the driver and could lead the vehicle to veer off its lane, which could result in accidents," said Al Dhaheri. "Studies have revealed that many road accidents were being caused by a lack of concentration and negligence mainly because of drivers speaking on mobile phones, chatting on social media or taking videos while driving."

Traffic officials are reminding drivers to refrain from snapping "selfies" or images while driving as doing so diverts their attention from the road and impairs their ability to react to other vehicles, causing them to run red lights or swerve into other lanes without warning.

The decision to put down the mobile phone while driving is not just a matter of personal choice; it's a commitment to the safety and well-being of ourselves and those sharing the road. As we navigate the fast-paced world of technology, let's not forget the fundamental responsibility we hold behind the wheel. By choosing to be present, focused, and attentive, we contribute to a safer driving environment for everyone. Remember, the call or message can wait, but the safety of yourself and others cannot. Let's drive up our awareness, putting safety first on every journey.







Justice in pixes

THE PROPER USE OF SOCIAL MEDIA IN LAW ENFORCEMENT CAN PLAY A VITAL ROLE IN CRIMINAL INVESTIGATIONS AND THE PURSUIT OF JUSTICE

BOSTON MARATHON BLAST

WHEN: APRIL 15, 2013

WHERE: BOSTON, MASSACHUSETTS, UNITED STATES

The Boston Marathon attack on April 15, 2013, involved the detonation of two homemade pressure cooker bombs near the race's finish line, separated by 14 seconds and 210 yards (190 m). This incident resulted in the tragic deaths of three individuals and left over 260 people injured.

The role of social media emerged significantly in the aftermath as law enforcement agencies aimed to identify and arrest the individuals responsible for the blast.

Shortly after the incident, the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) released images of two suspects, leveraging social media to crowdsource information and identify potential leads. The dissemination of these images on social media triggered an extensive online manhunt, with the public responding promptly and collaboratively. Users actively analysed photos and videos, providing valuable information to investigators.

This became instrumental in identifying the suspects, later revealed to be brothers Tamerlan and Dzhokhar Tsarnaev. Following their identification, the Tsarnaev brothers committed further crimes, including the killing of MIT policeman Sean Collier and a subsequent car kidnapping. A shootout with the police in Watertown ensued, resulting in severe injuries to two officers.

Dzhokhar was discovered hiding in a boat in a Watertown resident's backyard, leading to his arrest after sustaining gunshot wounds.

Tamerlan was shot multiple times and run over by his brother while attempting to escape in a stolen car, resulting in Tamerlan's death.

During interrogation, Dzhokhar claimed self-radicalisation, asserting no connection to external terrorist groups and indicating he followed his brother's lead. He faced 30 charges, including malicious destruction of property resulting in death. Two months later, he received a death sentence, later vacated by the United States Court of Appeals for the First Circuit. Following Supreme Court consideration in the 'United States versus Tsarnaev' case, the death penalty was upheld, reversing the First Circuit Court's decision, with ongoing appeals.

HANNAH ANDERSON KIDNAPPING

WHEN: AUGUST 3, 2013

WHERE: BOULEVARD, CALIFORNIA, UNITED STATES

The abduction of 16-year-old Hannah Anderson on the afternoon of August 3, 2013, gained widespread attention in the United States. James Lee DiMaggio, a family friend, committed the kidnapping after murdering Hannah's mother and brother.

The police investigations began with the discovery of a gruesome crime scene in Boulevard, California, in August 2013. The residence of James was engulfed in a fire, revealing two charred bodies in the aftermath — identified as Hannah's mother, Christina Anderson, and her 8-year-old brother, Ethan.

Police determined that Christina had been bound, gagged, and fatally beaten. Both bodies were severely burned, hindering immediate recognition. Investigation of the debris led authorities to conclude that James had not only perpetrated the killings but had also set the house ablaze in an attempt to conceal the crime.

Concerns for Hannah's safety arose immediately amongst police and family members, as she had last been seen after cheerleading practice, and was scheduled to receive a ride home from James.

Amber Alerts were swiftly disseminated across various social media platforms such as Facebook and Twitter, engaging a broad audience and seeking public assistance in locating the missing teenager.

A group of horseback riders discovered James and Hannah in the Frank Church–River of No Return Wilderness in Idaho on August 10, a week after the abduction. Having seen information about the case in the news and recognising the two from the Amber Alert, the

riders alerted law enforcement, leading to the successful rescue of Hannah. During a confrontation at the campsite, James was killed by FBI agents in a shootout.

At the time of her rescue, Hannah was unaware of her mother and brother's tragic demise. In an emotional interview with *Today* in 2013, she recounted Ethan's compassionate nature, mentioning that he "had a really big heart". She also acknowledged her mother's influence in instilling a resilient spirit that helped her cope with the harrowing experience.

BABY DOE MURDER

WHEN: JUNE 25, 2015

IE: BOSTON, MASSACHUSETTS, UNITED STATES

The Baby Doe case unfolded in Boston in June 2015, when the lifeless body of an unidentified young girl was discovered on the shores of Deer Island in Boston, Massachusetts, on June 25, 2015.

The child, referred to as "Baby Doe", remained an enigma for months, prompting widespread public interest. The discovery took place when a woman walking her dog stumbled upon the tragic scene, initiating an investigation with the primary objective of identifying the child.

Faced with a dearth of leads, law enforcement turned to social media for public assistance. The National Center for Missing & Exploited Children released a computer-generated image depicting the possible appearance of the girl. The goal was to elicit tips leading to her identity and to uncover the individual or individuals responsible for her tragic fate.

Following the release of the reconstruction image on various social media platforms and nationwide news coverage, the case garnered substantial public attention.

The turning point occurred when a composite image of Baby Doe was shared on Facebook by a family friend. A vigilant tipster recognised the child as Bella Bond. The information swiftly reached the authorities, resulting in the identification of Bella's mother, Rachelle Bond, and her mother's partner, Michael McCarthy, as the prime suspects.

Police investigations revealed that Bella had been murdered by McCarthy, with her mother involved in the subsequent cover-up. Bella's lifeless body had been disposed of on Deer Island, and the couple had fabricated a false narrative to mislead authorities

Bella's mother faced charges of being an "accessory after the fact" and pleaded guilty through a plea deal. Meanwhile, McCarthy faced murder charges and was convicted of second-degree murder. On June 28, 2017, he received a life sentence with the possibility of parole in the future.

RIGBY MURDER

MAY 22, 2013

WOOLWICH, LONDON, UNITED KINGDOM

The brutal murder of British soldier Lee Rigby on May 22, 2013, in Woolwich, London, drew international attention. Fusilier Lee Rigby, a drummer in the Royal Regiment of Fusiliers, became the target of two extremists, Michael Adebolajo and Michael Adebowale, near the Royal Artillery Barracks in London.

Armed with knives and a cleaver, the assailants intentionally ran over Rigby with a car before carrying out a horrific attack in broad daylight. Shockingly, they lingered at the crime scene, urging bystanders to film and photograph the aftermath with their smartphones.

The attackers made no effort to escape. Instead, they confronted law enforcement officers until they were shot and apprehended by armed police. Adding to the gravity of their actions, the assailants requested witnesses to record statements justifying the killing, intending to disseminate their extremist message through social media.

Immediately following the attack, images and videos circulated rapidly on platforms such as Twitter and YouTube, triggering a public outcry and demand for justice. The distressing footage and shared images online proved to be crucial evidence for the subsequent investigation.

In the ensuing trial, both Adebolajo and Adebowale were convicted of the murder of Lee Rigby. They received life sentences, with Adebolajo handed a whole-life order, ensuring he will never be released.

BENJAMIN OF TUDELA'S ARABIAN CHRONICLES

TRAVELLING CITY TO CITY, BENJAMIN OF TUDELA OFFERS UNIQUE INSIGHTS INTO THE DIVERSE CULTURES OF THE ARAB ISLAMIC EAST. FROM ALEPPO'S RICH HISTORY TO THE CALIPH'S OPULENT PALACE IN IRAQ, HIS OBSERVATIONS PROVIDE A CAPTIVATING GLIMPSE INTO A HISTORICAL ERA

journey from the Iberian Peninsula to the Arab Islamic East (1165-1173) provides a unique perspective on history. With meticulous footnotes, he unveils the conditions of each city he visits, highlighting the era and Islamic rulers. Continuing his exploration, Benjamin delves into ancient cities, such as Damascus and Babylon. He offers a concise yet rich narrative that illuminates a bygone era through the eyes of a perceptive and astute observer.

Benjamin writes: "In Damascus, there is a mosque for Muslims known as the Damascus Mosque. I did not find another building comparable to its beauty. It is said that it was built on the ruins of the palace of Ibn Hadad Malik Iram, and its walls were made by magicians.

"In this mosque, there are parts embellished with gold and silver, round in shape, and very large so that it can accommodate several people at a time.

"Amongst the relics of this mosque are huge bones. It is said that these bones belonged to "King Anaq", and his name is intricately engraved on stones adorning his grave."

Here, Benjamin's narrative ends. A comment is necessary on it, as he said Damascus; today, it is known as Mount Qasioun.

As for the "Damascus Mosque", this is the Umayyad Mosque in our present day. The mosque was built between 705 and 715 on the orders of the Caliph al-Walid I. It was built on the site of the Byzantine church of Saint John the Baptist. The mosque still houses the relics of the Prophet Yahya today. The church itself had replaced a Roman temple.

The Umayyad Caliph Al-Walid bin Abd al-Malik renewed the building and added minarets to it. As for "King Anaq", it's a character in a Jewish myth that recounts a historical event with the phrase, "A long time ago, Auj bin Anaq."

From Damascus, Benjamin continues his journey, passing through Beirut, Sidon, Tyre, Acre, and Haifa. He only enumerates descriptions of these cities, and the Jews there, and explains their social situation.

FROM NABLUS TO MOSUL

About Nablus, also known as "Shechem" in the Torah, Benjamin tells us about a sect of Samaritan Jews. He arrives in Mosul (in present-day Iraq), describing it as a town in Assyria the Great.

An illustrated Latin version of

the book titled 'The Itinerary of

Mosul is cut through the middle by the Tigris River, with a bridge existing between them and Nineveh, on the left bank of the Tigris River at the confluence of the Khosr (a tributary of the Tigris). The remains of the ancient city of Nineveh are today found on the outskirts of the modern city of Mosul, which stands on the other side of the river.

Amongst the relics of this mosque are huge bones. It is said that these bones belonged to "King Anaq", and his name is intricately engraved on stones adorning his grave

From Mosul, Benjamin then travels to the centre of Iraq, talking about Anbar, a town near Fallujah, located on the Euphrates River, until he arrives in Baghdad. This was during the days of the Abbasid Caliphate (or Abbasid Empire).

He states: "Baghdad, the great city, the seat of the Caliph's kingdom, Commander of the Faithful, the Abbasid. The Caliphate palace in Baghdad spreads across Tanuf. Its circumference is three miles, with a garden in the middle."


He also passes through Homs and Hama (in Syria) quickly. When he reaches Aleppo (about 310 km north of Damascus), he describes it as the seat of the Kingdom of Nur al-Din, surrounded by a solid wall. "The city is not watered by rivers or springs, so the people collect rainwater. In every house, there's a well, in which rainwater is collected," he writes.


In Benjamin's own words, he describes Aleppo as an ancient city, a point of conflict between the Persians and the Byzantines. The Arabs entered it in 638 AD, and the Hamdanid Dynasty arose there. It was besieged by the Crusaders several times, and Salah Uddin recovered it for the Ayyubid Sultanate in the year 1183.

JOURNEY THROUGH IRAQ

After leaving Syria, Benjamin heads to northern Irag, a place teeming with all sorts of interesting animals. He writes: "In Al-Rawdah, there's this big lake; its waters come from the Tigris River. The Caliph would go there to hunt and picnic, gathering all kinds of birds and fish. It is also the place where the Caliph holds an Al-Abbasi council.

"The Caliph is good to the Jews, loyal, and has a number of people in his entourage. He is knowledgeable in several languages. He eats from the palm of his hands, and he makes brocade shawls. His men sell it to princes and nobles, bringing him abundant wealth. The Caliph is described as a man of piety, honesty, uprightness, and seeking





goodness for the pilgrims who visit him on their journey to Mecca."


Benjamin also observes that there was a supervisor in the Caliphate palace. He says: "Pilgrims come to her with full respect and humility."

He adds: "There are a number of princes from the house of the Caliphate detained in their own palaces, guarded to prevent any disobedience against the Caliph. However, they live in elegant palaces, owning cities and estates that bring them abundant wealth.

"In the Caliphate palace, there is something that boggles my mind. The buildings contain marble and decorated tiles in gold, adorned with rare and precious stones. The palace holds abundant treasures and safes overflowing with gold, silk, and precious jewels. It is the custom of the Caliph to leave his palace on Eid Al-Fitr. People gather from far and wide to celebrate and watch. When he comes out, he rides a painted horse wearing a gold-brocaded cloak and silver. His head is crowned with a studded hood adorned with precious stones.

"The procession moves surrounded by Muslim nobles, all dressed in bright clothes, riding on horseback. They are the





great Arabs, Turks, Daylamites, Persians, Ghaz, and from the surrounding areas of Samarkand. The procession heads to the Grand Mosque located in Bab al-Basra (Gate of Basra), adorning all the roads and markets with the most beautiful fabrics and silk. People greet him with cheers, calling out, 'Peace be upon the Commander of the Faithful and the light of Islam'.

"The Caliph responds with a wave. If he enters the mosque, he ascends the pulpit and delivers a sermon explaining the rulings of Sharia law. After the prayer, the ceremonies end, and the Caliph returns to his palace with the same hospitality."

DAR-AL-MARISTAN

Benjamin recounts: "In Baghdad, there are about sixty physicians' stores which are provided from the Caliph's house with drugs and whatever else may be required. Every sick man who comes is maintained at the Caliph's expense and is medically treated. Here is a building which is called Dar-al-Maristan, where they keep charge of the demented people who have become insane in the towns through the great heat in the summer."

He adds: "About 40,000 Jews live in Baghdad with safety, pride, and prosperity under the rule of the Caliph."

The city of "Baghdad" had conflicting opinions about its name in ancient times. Some say it means "Bustan" and "Dad" is the name of a Persian man from the days of King Shirvan. Others suggest it comes from the verbal Aramaic "Kadad House". Al-Muthanna bin Harith Al-Shaibani found a market for horses near a river called "Degla", and it was known as Baghdad

Market before Al-Mansour built the city more than a hundred years ago.

Regarding the caliph "seeking goodness for the pilgrims", history tells us that this caliph was one of the best, rectifying injustices, and being stern against corruption.

'RUINS OF BABYLON'

From Baghdad, Benjamin heads towards Babylon, writing a description under the title "Ruins of Babylon". Before we delve into his words, some background information is necessary about this city and the Jews taken captive in it.

Historically, numerous captivities befell the Jews due to military campaigns against them. The first of these were Assyrian campaigns around 700 BC, followed by another after 22 years, and a third after 70 years. Each time, the Assyrians took a number of them as prisoners to the northern part of Persia, and they did not return.

The Chaldean state later appeared in Persia, with King Nebuchadnezzar ending their existence in Palestine, taking them captive and settling them in Babylon around 600 BC.

The Jews lived in Babylon for about a hundred years, during which the "Babylonian Talmud" was written, containing explanations and orders of the Torah. In Babylon, the Prophet Ezekiel appeared, and his shrine, named Dhul-Kifl, still exists today.

Returning to Benjamin of Tudela's account of the ruins of Babylon, he describes it as "ancient Babylon the Great", with nothing remaining today but ruins stretching for about 30 miles.


The palace of Bakht Nasr is visible but people are afraid to enter due to the large number of scorpions and snakes. Five kilometres away lies the shrine of Ezekiel on the bank of the Euphrates, a building containing sixty silos, each a tower.

FATE OF THE JEWS IN BABYLON

In the middle of the largest silo is a pulpit, behind which stands the shrine of the Prophet Ezekiel. The Jews perform pilgrimage there every year.

It is a fact that the Jews enjoyed protection under the benign rule of the Caliphs. One might ask how the fate of the Jews ended in Babylon. The answer is that in 540 BC, approximately 70 years later, Cyrus occupied Persian Babylon and allowed them to return to their country.

However, the fate of the Jews took a different turn when the Romans came, subdued them, and dispersed them across its expansive territory and kingdoms.





A pinch of wisdom: Skipping salt cuts heart disease risk

A study presented at the recent annual meeting of the European Society of Cardiology in Amsterdam found that forgoing the salt shaker could reduce the risk of heart disease by a remarkable 18 per cent.

Researchers from Kyungpook National University Hospital in South Korea analysed data from the UK Biobank, encompassing over half a million participants aged 40 to 70 in the United Kingdom. Their aim was to investigate the link between salt consumption and atrial fibrillation, a condition characterised by an irregular heartbeat or arrhythmia, which, if left unaddressed, can lead to life-threatening complications like stroke, heart failure and blood clots.

They found that those who abstained from adding salt to their meals entirely exhibited an 18 per cent lower risk of being



diagnosed with atrial fibrillation compared to their salt-savvy counterparts who sprinkled salt with every bite.

This finding underscores the potential health benefits of a salt-conscious diet.

Those who occasionally indulged in salt experienced a 15 per cent lower chance of heart issues, while even the moderate salt users saw a 12 per cent decreased risk compared to those who always used salt.

Your favourite music can tackle pain, new study reveals



New research has uncovered the healing potential of music. According to a study published in the journal *Frontiers in*

Pain Research, listening to music can significantly reduce pain.

The study, conducted at McGill

University in Montreal, involved participants receiving moderately painful thermal stimuli on their inner forearms, akin to the sensation of a hot cup of tea against the skin. During the experiments, participants were asked to listen to music excerpts lasting about seven minutes.

As per the results pain was notably diminished when participants listened to their favourite tunes.

Darius Valevicius, a doctoral student at Montreal University, explained that the emotional experiences triggered by music contributed to lower ratings of pain unpleasantness.

"We found that reports of moving or bittersweet emotional experiences seem to result in lower ratings of pain unpleasantness, which was driven by more intense enjoyment of the music and more musical chills," Valevicius told a media report.

These "musical chills", the researchers said, reflect a neurophysiological process that effectively blocks pain signals.

Previous studies have highlighted the emotional influence of music, suggesting its potential benefits for conditions such as depression and speech impediments.



Osprey breeding population soars in UAE, new EAD survey finds

A recent survey conducted by the **Environment Agency** - Abu Dhabi (EAD) on Osprev breeding in the Capital has found an encouraging trend: the Osprey population is on the rise.

The survey, deemed the most comprehensive of its kind in the UAE. documented an impressive 127 breeding pairs of Ospreys across more than 40 coastal and island locations in

the emirate. This data underscores the positive trajectory of Osprey numbers and highlights the importance of ongoing conservation efforts.

The Western Osprey, referred to locally as "Dammi", is a native breeding bird species in the UAE. It preys on fish and primarily inhabits marine environments, with minimal nesting occurring inland.



Ospreys in the UAE engage in breeding activities from December to March, and they typically construct sizable ground nests comprising dried vegetation around their nesting sites.

This species is incorporated into the Action Plan aimed at conserving migratory birds of prey as part of the Memorandum of Understanding on the Conservation of

Migratory Birds of Prey in Africa and Eurasia (Raptor MoU).

The EAD highlighted that the increasing Osprey population serves as a positive indicator of the overall ecological quality of the marine ecosystems in the region.

Ahmed Al Hashemi. Executive Director of the Terrestrial and Marine Biodiversity Sector at the EAD, said, "The comprehensive survey and regular monitoring of the breeding population will provide the agency with

the information on the Osprey to assess trends in numbers and enhance efforts to protect and preserve the birds."

"Fifty-six per cent of the Osprey nests are present in EAD's marine nature reserves, which enhances the agency's role in protecting and preserving the environment." Al Hashemi added.

158.3 million women, girls at risk of poverty due to climate change

A recent **United Nations** report launched in Abu Dhabi underscored the grave threat of climate change to women's wellbeing and gender equality.

The report, titled 'Progress on the Sustainable Development Goals: The gender snapshot 2023', produced by UN Women and the **UN** Department of Economic and Social Affairs, revealed that

under a worst-case climate scenario, up to 158.3 million more women and girls could be pushed into poverty globally by midcentury, exceeding the number of men and boys affected by 16 million. Moreover, the prevalence of food insecurity could rise by



up to an additional 236 million women and girls, in contrast to 131 million more men

The report highlights the urgent need for action, suggesting that investing in a Sustainable Development Goals (SDG)

stimulus package could reduce the number of women in extreme poverty. However, the most effective strategy remains mitigating climate change to prevent further escalation.

The report advocates for a multi-stakeholder approach to tackle the problem, underscoring the significance of enhancing women's access to education, healthcare. economic prospects, and information.

In response, the report encourages comprehensive and unified initiatives to promote gender equality, urging directed financing and co-operation amongst stakeholders in support of the gender equality agenda.
